Dr. Christina Zaker: *At The Well: What the Women in Scriptures can Teach us About Today*



Fr. Michael Mitchell LC: *From Maintenance to Mission – Pope Francis' Vision for the Church*

In 1999, Fr. Michael entered the Legion of Christ's novitiate in Cheshire, CT. After taking his first vows he studied humanities for two years in Salamanca, Spain. In Rome he completed a master's degree in philosophy from the Legion's Pontifical Athenaeum graduating *Summa cum Laude*. While completing his theology degree he worked for two years on the team of seminarian formators of the Legion's headquarters in Rome.
